
ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION GOOD BUDGET IN 2011





IMPACT PROJECTS PROGRESS REPORT

- In order to achieve the Department's Vision and the Mission Statement, the following 17 impact projects are being implemented in 2011/2012:
 - Curriculum Development Materials.
 - Secondary School Equipment.
 - Curriculum Teacher/Student Resource Material Development.
 - Rehabilitating Education Print Shop.
 - Quality Development of Standards Measurement.
 - Procure and Distribute Secondary School Books in PNG.
 - Reading Education Project.
 - Enhancing Quality in Teaching Through Television.
 - Education Training and Human Resource Development Program (EDF9).
 - Inspectors Housing and Transportation.
 - Maintenance of Sogeri, Kerevat, Aiyura and Passam National High Schools.
 - School Development and Maintenance Grants (SDMG).
 - Flexible Open and Distance Education (FODE).
 - TVET Sector Projects.
 - Qualification Upgrading Skills Development.
 - Establish Library in every Schools.
 - Education Subsidies.

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT MATERIALS

- K30 Million for Curriculum Development Materials has been received and two separate Tenders Instruments were developed in 2011.
- List of books for Elementary, Primary & Secondary have been identified and approved by SAC/BOS.
- Two suppliers have been identified through CSTB Tender No. 2338/2339.
- Procurement for 1st CSTB Tender No. 2339 to commence in May 2012 and 2338 soon after.
- Door to door distribution be undertaken in Oct 12

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE SECONDARY SCHOOL EQUIPMENT

- K20 Million is allocated for purchasing High/Secondary Schools Science Equipment.
- NDoE Project Committee was formed to oversee the implementation of school equipment.
- 36 High schools & 29 Secondary schools have been identified to receive these equipment.
- Currently working on bidding documents for Central Suppliers and Tenders Board (CSTB) for advertisement provided that APC documents approved by Treasury Department.

SECONDARY SCHOOL SCIENCE INFRASTRUCTURE

- K10m has been divided among all the high schools and secondary schools throughout Papua New Guinea. Approximately K70,000 per school
- Cheques have been raised and will be paid to the schools during the second quarter
- Schools are required to do the scoping
- Schools are instructed to report of the progress

NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL

- K40m from 2011 for the four National High Schools
- K10m each for Sogeri, Kerevat, Passam and Aiyura
- Cheques for K10m have been raised but have not reached the schools
- Of the money for Passam, K5m to be used for environment damages and land settlement as directed by the Education Minister.

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE CURRICULUM TEACHER/STUDENT RESOURCE MATERIALS DEVELOPMENT

- Planning & Final consultation of English syllabus to be completed by May. (Elementary)
- The teacher resource books are with the Publishing section for editorial and graphics work. (Lower primary)
- Eight teachers resource books in for printing. (Primary)
- Nine provinces consulted on Teacher resource book development. (Secondary)

NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL

- Kerevat NHS was closed for maintenance in 2011 and 2012 however, on the directive from the Prime Minister, school has re-opened with 4 classes of Grade 11 with 15 teachers.
- AusAid SPF has assisted in putting up new classrooms and staff houses
- AusAId has carried out scoping work for improving the sewerage and water supply infrastructure.

EDUCATION INFRASTRCUTURE PROGRAM

- Of the K30m, K29m will be for capital works and K1m for project management
- This program will increase capacity for Grade 8 Graduates to continue in Secondary or TVET.
- Implementation and Management Framework developed and submitted to TMT for approval on how to execute the project.

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE REHABILITATION OF EDUCATION PRINT SHOP

- K1 million received and printing equipment identified, quotations obtained.
- Payments raised and are with Chief
 Account awaiting materials to be supplied.
- All equipment to be installed and operational in June 2012h.

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE QUALITY DEVELOPMENT OF STANDARDS MEASUREMENT

- K5m made available in 2011 for Curriculum Standard Monitoring Test (CSMT) and EGRA
- Developed and delivered CSMT for 2010 & 2011 for Grades 5&7 in 2011
- Progress slow due to funds parked incorrect items. Wasted 5 months.
- Supported EGRA Grade 3 in Madang, Morobe and East New Britain.

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE PROCURE AND DISTRIBUTE SECONDARY SCHOOL BOOKS IN PNG

- AusAid distribution of Secondary books totalling AUD\$11 million in June, 2011.
- AusAid 2nd round of Secondary books totalling AUD\$14 million will be distributed by June, 2011.
- This was executed by AusAid alone.
- Monitoring and evaluation of its effectiveness as yet to be done.

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE READING EDUCATION PROJECT

- K50 million grant from World Bank to improve reading skills at Elementary and Primary levels.
- Agreement signed between Government of PNG & World Bank.
- Project positions advertised and candidates recruited.
- Trials of EGRA done in NCD in May, 2011 and in Madang and East New Britain mid 2011
- Awareness, training, procurement and distribution of Books in 2012

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE

ENHANCING QUALITY IN TEACHING THROUGH TELEVISION.

- K1m was appropriated for EQUITV in 2011
- 28 TV Lessons for Gr. 6 Personal Development and 17 Gr. 7 Social Science TV programs produced in 2011
- Gr.6-8 Maths and Science programs broadcast 2011
- 18 DEPI programs broadcast.
- 30 EQUITV program equipment for 6
 provinces purchased to be installed in 2012

DOE National Education Media officers with the assistance of locals put up a satellite dish at Walete Primary School in SHP to receive the TV lessons.



PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE

EDUCATION TRAINING AND HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (EDF9)

- ETHRDP had four components;
 Textbooks, Scholarship, Infrastructure & Training.
- 2,688,000 textbooks supplied to schools.
- 240 rural student teachers sponsored to do teacher training at Dauli, Gaulim and Bomana teachers colleges.
- Dauli & Gaulim teachers' colleges dormitories & classrooms built.
- Training done for TVET Instructors in

PROGRESS REPORT CONTINUE

INSPECTORS HOUSING & TRANSPORTATION

- This project began in 2005 to provide——
 Inspectors Houses and provide
 transportation for Standard Officers work
- In 2011 K5m was appropriated an din 2012 additional K8m was given to expand the program
- APC & CSTB approval sought to build inspectors' houses and purchase boats & vehicles.

MAINTENANCE OF SOGERI, KEREVAT, AIYURA & PASSAM NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOLS PROGRESS REPORT.

- K40 million for Maintenance of Sogeri, Kerevat, Aiyura & Passam National High Schools have been appropriated.
- Trust Deeds Instruments have been completed.
- Scoping, including design solutions for the sewerage and water supply systems.
- Contracts to be awarded for maintenance and construction work in June.
- Funds yet to be transferred to the Department of Education.

REHABILIATION OF EDUCATION SECTOR INFRASTRUCTURE

- K70m for Schools Development and Maintenance has been paid to 69 districts and Iarowari High Schools all in manual cheques; no schools have reported receiving any money from this
- Reports have come out that cheques have bounced or misplace
- Cheque totalling K20m has been presented
- K50m have yet to be accounted for
- DoE is required to monitor use and evaluate the impact of the funds disbursed. There is no budget for this activity.

FLEXIBLE OPEN AND DISTANCE EDUCATION

Positions advertised (internal/external)

 The Trust Deeds for GoPNG & WB funds are completed and with DoF.

TVET SECTOR PROJECTS

- Scoping completed for maintenance and renovation work on selected staff houses for Technical and Business Colleges.
- 2 new male students dormitories for Madang and Port Moresby Technical Colleges concept drawings completed.
- 2 new Administration Office Buildings for Goroka Technical and Port Moresby Business College concept drawings completed.

QUALIFICATIONS UPGRADING SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

- 262 Sponsored teachers are currently undertaking various courses both in country and overseas.
- 12 teachers undertaking various Masters Degree programs in-country and one lecturer undertaking Masters Degree program overseas.
- 1 officer completing PhD studies in Australia.



ESTABLISH LIBRARY IN EVERY

• Books from local suppliers purchased.

 14 school libraries and 2 public libraries visited in Milne Bay & Eastern Highlands.



EDUCATION SUBSIDIES

- 2012 is the third year of Government's fee free policy for Basic to Grade 10 and 75% for Grade 11 and 12
- Out of K300m, K228.9m has paid
- K28.05m paid to Elementary, K93.5m to Primary, K94m to Secondary, K4.5m to VTC and K2.98m to NHS.
- 70% funding has been disbursed.
- 30% updating bank accounts & enrolment figures
