Goals

- c. a particular focus on fiscal decentralisation policy reform, relating the issues to the broader decentralisation reform debate, but also including:
 - (i) principles of design of an effective fiscal decentralisation system;
 - (ii) issues, possibilities and problems involved in specific fiscal decentralisation reform proposals.
- d. 'lessons' that might be learnt from the evidence based policy-making process developed by the National Economic and Fiscal Commission.

Outputs

To include:

- A set of the papers presented (aim to have them available at the workshops);
- A report of workshop discussion circulated to participants;
- A policy briefing note;
- An edited book of papers, to be published by the joint sponsors (INA, UPNG, CLRC, appropriate SI institution, and SSGM) as soon as possible after the workshops.
