



'NBC not maintaining fixed register of assets'

THE National Broadcasting Commission failed to maintain a fixed register of assets worth more than K111 million for several years, according to the Report of the Auditor-General for 2016.

Auditor-General Philip Nauga said that the 2014 audit - which was done in 2016 - found that NBC had failed to properly record, account and control movement of assets including land and buildings, plant and equipment, furniture and fittings and motor vehicles.

"Accordingly, the cost of assets totalling K111,978,884 and accumulated depreciation balance totalling K75,528,522 were carried over in the

general ledger since 2012 with any movements," the report said "The issues were noted in my

THE Department of Lands and Physical Planning has confirmed that a portion of land in Collingwood Bay. Northern, which has been the subject of debate, belongs to the State.
